Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

WHAT?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- Social Security number
- account history
- transaction history
- income
- payment history
- credit history

When you are *no longer* our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.

HOW?

All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons American National Bank chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

What we do

How does American National Bank protect my personal information? To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. The measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

How does American National Bank collect my personal information? We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- Deposit Money
- pay your bills
- seek financial
- open an account
- apply for a loan
- seek tax advice

We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.

Why can't I limit all sharing? Federal law gives you the right to limit only

- sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes – information about your creditworthiness
- affiliates from using your information to market to you
- sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you

State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.

Definitions

Affiliates Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *Our affiliates include American National Leasing Company and Archer Title.*

Nonaffiliates Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *American National Bank does not share information with nonaffiliated third parties.*

Joint marketing A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.

- *American National Bank does not jointly market.*
