Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.		
What?	<ul> <li>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</li> <li>Social Security number and income</li> <li>transaction history and payment history</li> <li>credit history and overdraft history</li> <li>When you are <i>no longer</i> our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</li> </ul>		
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons American National Bank & Trust chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Definitions			
Affiliates	<ul> <li>Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</li> <li>Our affiliates include nonfinancial companies, such as American National Leasing Company, AmNat Insurance Services, Inc. and Archer Title of Texas DBA American National Title of Texas.</li> </ul>		
Nonaffiliates	<ul> <li>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</li> <li>American National Bank &amp; Trust does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.</li> </ul>		
Joint marketing	<ul> <li>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</li> <li>American National Bank &amp; Trust doesn't jointly market.</li> </ul>
